**Specific Project Purpose/Objective:** To increase habitat complexity in 1.0 mile of side channels for juvenile spring Chinook salmon, bull trout and other native species by adding coarse woody material (CWM).

## Context and Expected Benefits (Contribution to Whole Watershed Restoration)

There is a lack of complex side channel habitat in the upper McKenzie River below Trail Bridge Dam, particularly for juvenile bull trout and spring Chinook salmon, both threatened under the ESA. Important spawning habitat for both species is located just upstream of the project area. Due to the springfed hydrology of the upper McKenzie River, LWM (6"-12" diameter) was determined to be of sufficient size to be stable and function as intended. This project contributes to the overall McKenzie River sub-basin bull trout and spring Chinook recovery plans, developed by multiple partners.

## **Work Performed and Status**



We utilized YCC crews as a cost-effective way to add CWM to the side channel while providing local jobs. Crew members used timber dollies and log carriers to transport wood from an upland site to side channels. Over 45 pieces of CWM were added in 9 separate accumulations – each

consisting of 5 logs strategically placed for maximum stability and retention. Accumulations were then filled in with finer woody material to mimic natural log jams.
